Purpose:

The annual ECCLA/USC-CCR Teacher Recognition Awards seek to acknowledge outstanding classroom teachers whose efforts go above and beyond the call of duty and benefit students enrolled in ECCLA designated schools.

Eligibility:

Must be full-time teachers working in one of the designated ECCLA parochial or public schools. This includes schools in the area bounded by Olympic Blvd, Alameda Avenue, Slauson Blvd, and Crenshaw Blvd (full listing at www.eccla.org, and in attached page). There can be a maximum of two nominations from each school.

Awards:

Seven \$500 cash awards, provided by USC Civic and Community Relations, will be presented at an award ceremony and reception to be held on May 15th, 2008. All nominees will be invited to attend the reception.

Nomination Process:

Anyone associated with an ECCLA school may nominate a teacher for this award. The nomination form may be reproduced. An individual may nominate more than one teacher. **Teachers may be re-nominated.** Supporting letters and documents must be submitted, but will not be returned.
